



EARLY CHILDHOOD

At Saint Paul School, our Early Childhood Programs strive to foster a love of God and a love for learning in our youngest students. Through hands-on experiences, young children are encouraged to learn by exploring the world around them through a balanced program of structured, guided activities and free play opportunities.



Preschool (Age 3)

Saint Paul School's Preschool program is based in our belief that each child is a unique and special child of God. The program is designed to foster the spiritual, physical, cognitive and social-emotional development in our little ones. Our curriculum provides the structure and guidance children need to grow in a fun, safe, and nurturing environment. Children engage in multi-disciplinary experiences to explore and learn about the world around them by playing and interacting in the classroom. Through the Discover God's Children program, our Preschool students explore God's gift of life. They are introduced to literacy and numeracy readiness exercises through the Opening the World of Learning (OWL) Language Arts Curriculum.



The Preschool program is staffed by a certified teacher and an experienced paraprofessional.

Students must be 3 years old by August 31st

Children must be toilet trained to enroll in Preschool.



PreKindergarten (Age 4)

The PreKindergarten program is academically focused and based on developmentally appropriate practices that build upon the skills learned in our Preschool program, and to further prepare our students for our Kindergarten program. We use the OWL curriculum to continue working on the identification and formation of letters and numbers, and students are also introduced to Spanish. Our program offers many opportunities for singing, creative movement, guest readers, field trips, and interaction with our Grade 6 "Buddies". Through the Pflaum SEEDs program, children learn Bible stories and daily prayers. Students attend special classes in Art, Music, Physical Education, Information and Digital Media, Spanish, and the Second Step Social Skills Curriculum.

Children must be toilet trained to enrolled in PreKindergarten.
