Reading is an essential part of our curriculum at Saint Paul School. In order to further our students' education, each student is required to continue to read throughout the summer vacation. Students entering grade five will read The Trumpet of the Swan by E.B. White. They will complete the following "cheeseburger" book report rough draft. This rough draft will be due on the first day of school. The final draft will be completed in school. This assignment will be counted as a test grade on the first report card.

Instructions

1. Read the book Trumpet of the Swan by E.B. White. Take notes while you read. I suggest either keeping post-it notes on the pages, or if you can, write in pencil in the margins of the book.
2. Fill out the first draft of the "Cheeseburger" Book Report (see attached file). Be neat and fill out all of the sections. Use a pencil only.
3. Bring your rough draft to class. Make sure you understand the content. You will be responsible for discussing the events that happen in the book.

We encourage you to read other books as well in the summer. Keep track of your "Summer Reading Log" as well as short "Book Summaries" (provided) and hand it in to your teacher on the first day of school. This is optional. Here are some summer reading suggestions:

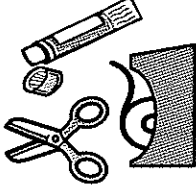
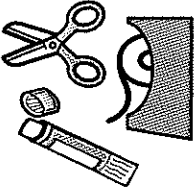

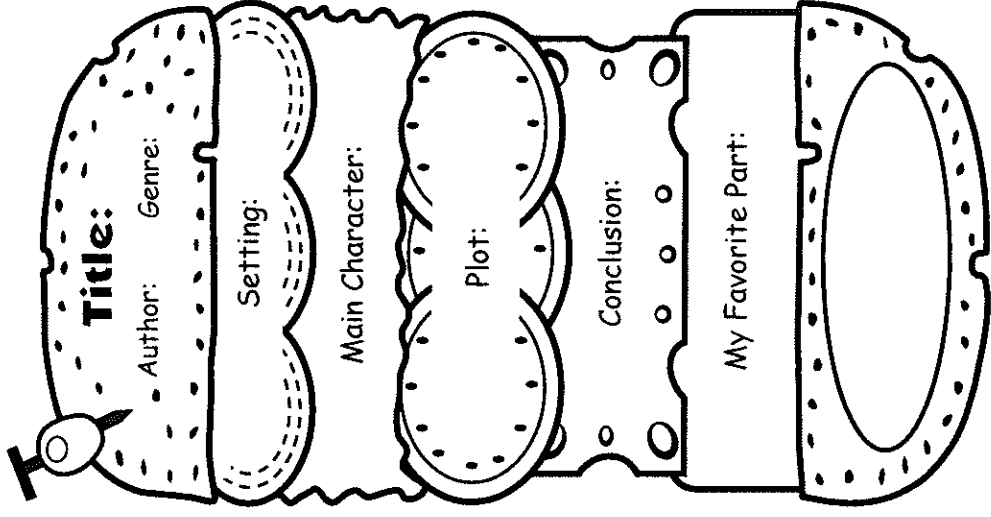
Assembling Directions

1. Using your edited First Draft, complete the writing sections in your cheeseburger templates.
2. Draw and color a picture in the bottom section of the bun.
3. Color all of the layers of your cheeseburger.
4. Cut out the four sections of the cheeseburger along the solid black lines.
5. Glue the bun and onion on top of the lettuce.
6. Glue the lettuce and tomato on top of the cheese.
7. Glue the cheese on top of the meat and bun.
8. Turn your cheeseburger over and tape the back sections to make sure that they are secure and will not fall apart.
